Tier 1 Services - What ALL Students K-12 Automatically Receive

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• College Preparatory Curriculum: Core courses, including honors and AP options, with AVID strategies for college readiness, binder checks, note-taking, and Freshman Seminar.• School Counseling Core Curriculum: Presentations and lessons on academic, college/career, and social-emotional development, covering skills like decision-making and stress management.• Schoolwide Programs and Activities: Assemblies, kindness initiatives, Project 150 support, Freshman Orientation, quarterly and annual award programs, "Be Kind" initiatives, and the "No Place for Hate" program. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Recognition Programs: Senior and underclassmen awards, Student of the Week/Month recognitions, and attendance recognitions through pins and lanyard privileges.• Family Engagement and Communication: FAFSA workshops, College and Career Expo, scholarship information sessions, family nights, translated communications, and information via school website/social media.• Schoolwide Behavioral Expectations: Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), attendance initiatives, kindness-based programs for a positive environment, Connectedness Walk-Throughs. |
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Tier 2 Services - Available Supplemental Supports & Enrichment Opportunities

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tutoring and Academic Support: Weekly teacher tutoring hours, APEX credit recovery, AP test prep, ACT/SAT Boot Camps, and drop-in academic support.• Social and Emotional Counseling: Solution-focused counseling, group counseling sessions, attendance support, and behavior contracts to support improved attendance and engagement. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Career and College Preparation: CTE Courses, College essay workshops, dual credit/AP enrollment guidance, pathway planning sessions, career exploration presentations, and support for specialized applications like NCAA eligibility.• Recognition and Motivation Programs: Incentive-based attendance programs, random acts of kindness, pins for achievement, and other recognitions to foster engagement and pride. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Family Resources and Education: Resume writing, job search support, and FAFSA assistance through family workshops focused on college/career readiness.• Peer and Near-Peer Mentorship: Freshman mentoring, AVID peer support, and other mentor programs designed to build connections and student support networks. |
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Tier 3 Services - Intensified Supports for Emergent, Severe, or Crisis Needs

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Crisis Intervention and Counseling: Immediate risk and threat assessments, crisis response, re-entry plans post-suspension, and on-campus SafeVoice for reporting emergencies.• Specialized Support Programs: Title I HOPE Program through McKinney-Vento Act support for homeless students (bus passes, resources from Project 150, and Three Square food programs), 504/IEP accommodations, and targeted support for foster youth. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Behavioral and Attendance Interventions: Attendance contracts, behavior contracts, chronic absenteeism hearings, and restorative practices to help students stay engaged and accountable.• The Harbor: Referrals to external services for mental health, substance abuse, trauma counseling, shelter, food security, and legal aid, as well as access to community partnerships. |
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
